THE OBJECTIVES

Overall Objectives

- To review progress made on implementation of the 2005 Durban consultation on Nutrition and HIV/AIDS participants' recommendations, with the view of determining best practices, identifying lessons learned and gaps, and the way forward towards scaling up nutrition interventions in the context of HIV.

Specific Objectives

- To provide technical updates on Nutrition and HIV/AIDS related to macronutrients, micronutrients, pregnancy and lactation, growth, infant and young child feeding, nutrition and anti-retroviral treatment.
- To provide an overview on nutrition and HIV/AIDS policies in the region.
- To orient countries with new programmatic guidelines on Nutrition and HIV/AIDS (UNICEF, WHO, WFP, FAO, UNHCR and bilateral partners – FANTA/AED among others)
- To share country experiences on the key nutrition components of HIV/AIDS prevention, control and mitigation in Eastern and Southern Africa (ESARO) – best practices, lessons learned and gaps.
- To develop a framework for accelerated implementation at scale and monitoring of the Nutrition and HIV/AIDS recommendations made in Durban – taking into considerations countries experiences since then, with regards to the best practices, lessons learned and gaps.
- To agree on the roles and responsibilities of key stakeholders in the implementation of the Nutrition and HIV/AIDS recommendations.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- Nutrition and HIV/AIDS crisis situation in the region and the implications well understood by participants
- National plans of action outlined for accelerated implementation of the Durban Nutrition and HIV/AIDS recommendations
- Consensus on the roles and responsibilities among the key stakeholders with suggested mechanisms for enhanced coordination and collaboration
